- In today's text, adding value and being of worth underpin the parable presented by the Lord.
- Vineyard owner approaches his fig tree.
- Finding a fruitless fig tree, he is disturbed and agitated.
- Expecting figs to be on a fig tree that's been around long enough to produce figs is not unreasonable.

I really feel today's lesson can help make our relations better and shore them up, make our lives more meaningful, and lead us to a more secure place in the Lord.

- Every organization, team, enterprise and congregation thrives when it has value-added members.
 - Persons who work to identify a purpose/role

- Those who depend on and work with us should be made better off as a result of our association
 - Seek to add value and be of worth

Notice the message at the Great Separation and Final Judgment -as you did it to (or failed to do it to) one of the least of these My brethren, you did it (or did not do it) to Me. See Matthew 25:31-46

LEARNING FROM THE LORD

- Jesus drew a crowd everywhere he went, in large part because he added value to those around Him.
 - Addressed needs
 - Lifted burdens
 - Comforted hearts
 - Healed hurts

 The Lord was so popular because of the spiritual and the physical value he added that He often had to consciously seek solitary places to rest and pray.

However, the report went around concerning Him all the more; and great multitudes came together to hear, and to be healed by Him of their infirmities. So He Himself often withdrew into the wilderness to pray.

2.PERFORM TO THE BEST OF YOUR ABILITY

Whatever your hands find to do, do it with your might; for there is no work or device or knowledge or wisdom in the grave where you are going. Ecclesiastes 9:10

3.BE WILLING TO SACRIFICE

- At the heart of successful relationships, homes and organizations are those who are willing to sacrifice for the good of the mission.
- Selfishness is the very antithesis of adding value.

- In order to add value, we often have to shelve our wants and preferences to benefit others.
 - Good leaders often forego their preferences if it would send the wrong message
 - Good parents often delay their own gratification to make sure their children have what they need
 - Husbands give up on or delay owning sports cars and other toys
